



Become a Mentor!

Overview

The LINKS Mentoring Program is seeking adult volunteer mentors to become positive role models for students at Elinor Hickey Jr./Sr. High School and Calvine Continuation High School.

This mentoring program is unique because it offers ongoing support to mentor/protégé matches by providing staff-facilitated, structured mentoring sessions each week. The mentor/protégé matches benefit from group interaction and one-to-one time and can always rely on staff to bring ideas for fun and meaningful interaction.

Mentors meet with their protégé(s) for one hour each week. The mentoring sessions consist of group activities combined with one-to-one time for mentors and protégés. The meetings and activities focus on specific themes, including Career Exploration/Job-Seeking Skills, Interpersonal/Life Skills, Financial Savvy and Money Management, Community Service/Service Learning projects, Health and Wellness, and Planning for the Future. A program staff member is assigned to each school and facilitates each group mentoring session, providing organized activities, materials and support.

We are seeking adult mentors to participate during the 2019-20 school year. You may commit to one semester or a full school year. Mentoring sessions occur during the school day, usually mid-morning or early afternoon. Participating students have expressed a desire to work with a mentor to help them prepare for life after high school and have completed an application and orientation process.
